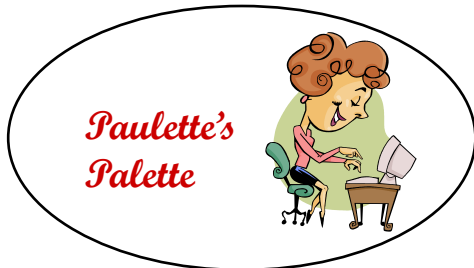
WHISPERING PINES TRAVELERS


